Josephine Louise Hendricks, oldest child of Wiley Winfield Hendricks and Minnie Tebeau Heidt, was born 17 Oct 1914 in Bulloch County, Georgia.

She was thirteen years old when her mother died and much of the responsibility of the house and the care of the younger children fell to her.

In 1936, she married John Clyde Robinson in Statesboro, Bulloch Co., Georgia. Clyde was born 25 Dec 1914. His father was a Baptist minister.

Clyde worked for a year or two as a farmer. Then he went to Coyne Electrical School in Chicago. He worked for awhile in Gainesville, Georgia. During World War II he moved to Savannah and worked there at the shipyard.

After the war, he moved to Jacksonville, N. C. He went into the electrical contracting business and also sold electric appliances. About 1957, he went into partnership with his brother-in-law, John Milton Hendricks, and two other partners. The business was known as AMPERE ELECTRIC COMPANY. His brother-in-law withdrew from this partnership in 1961. It was about 1963 that the partnership was entirely dissolved. Clyde and Josephine moved to Beaufort, S. C., where he went to work at Parris Island Marine Base. He retired from there on 28 Jun 1980.

Josephine and Clyde both were members of the Baptist Church. Josephine (called Jo) was a member of the choir for many years in the First Baptist Church in Jacksonville, N.C. Clyde was a deacon in that church.

Josephine contracted a rare disease about 1968 which grew progressively worse through the years. She died 29 Jul 1974, in Memorial Hospital in Savannah, Georgia. The funeral service was at First Baptist Church in Beaufort, S. C. She is buried in Eastside Cemetery, Statesboro, Bulloch Co., Ga., in the same lot as her father and mother-in-law.

She was a true homemaker, enjoying nothing more than doing something for her family. She particularly enjoyed sewing for her daughter, her daughter-in-laws, and her grandchildren.

She loved people, and someone usually was visiting at her house—both for long and short periods of time.

Mary Kathleen Hendricks was the third and youngest daughter of Wiley Winfield Hendricks and Minnie Tebeau Heidt. She was born <.hidden.>, at Savannah, Chatham Co., Ga.

She graduated from high school in 1939 at the Laboratory High School at Statesboro, Georgia, which was a training school for Georgia Teachers College. Her high school teachers encouraged her to continue her education in the college in Statesboro. She paid her way through college by working in the library of the college and graduated in 1942 with a B. S. degree in Elementary Education from Georgia Teachers College.

After graduating from college she taught at Odum, Ga. in high school. Her salary was \$100.00 per month with an \$18.00 a month supplement. When the supplement was withdrawn she resigned and went to work at the Southeastern Shipyard at Savannah, Ga. She worked in the Layout Department in the loft on the night shift and boarded with her oldest sister "Jo" Robinson and brother-in-law.

She enlisted in the W.A.V.E.S. of the U. S. Navy and served mostly at Charleston, S. C. for the duration of World War II.

Upon leaving service she taught second grade for one year at the Edison Park Elementary School at Ft. Myers, Florida.

She moved to Jacksonville, N. C. and lived with her oldest sister and brother-in-law and went to work on civil service, working in a clerk capacity at Camp Lejeune, N. C. in the hospital records section of the Naval Hospital.

She taught a nine year old Sunday School class and sang alto in the church choir of the Jacksonville Baptist church where she was later married.

At the time of her engagement she transferred from the position of clerk typist at the Naval Hospital to a second grade teaching position at the Midway Park Elementary School, which was a military school (civil service) while her fiancé attended Wake Forest College at Wake Forest, N. C.

On 8 Jun 1952 she was married to John William Banks by the Rev. L. Grady Burgess at the Jacksonville Baptist Church in Jacksonville, N. C.

John William Banks was born <.hidden.> in Akron, Ohio. He was the oldest child of Charles Kenneth Banks and Cereto Cochran Banks. He served in the Marine Corps for three years.

After their marriage they moved to Wake Forest where Kathleen taught at the Wake Forest Elementary School and John continued his studies at Wake Forest College. Kenneth Charles, their first child, was born <.hidden.>at the Rex Memorial Hospital in Raleigh, N. C. After his birth they moved to Akron, Ohio for the summer months, and then moved back to Jacksonville, N. C.

John commuted to Wake Forest and completed his B. A. degree while Kathleen taught fifth grade at the Thompson Elementary School in Jacksonville, N. C.

Their second child, Bruce Alan was born <.hidden.>at the Onslow County Hospital in Jacksonville, N. C.

John taught in the public school for a short time and then worked on civil service as a clerk typist for about six months. He was transferred to Cherokee, N. C. to the Indian reservation and worked on civil service under the Bureau of Indian Affairs as hospital administrator. Kathleen taught seventh grade in the civil service Indian School until her third child, Russell Eric, was born.

Russell Eric Banks was born <.hidden.>in the Swain County Hospital in Bryson City, N. C. The following November they moved to Sacaton, Arizona where John was the hospital administrator of the Indian Hospital on the Sacaton Indian reservation. She taught in the Indian school until he died in Sacaton on 30 Apr 1961. He was buried in Casa Grande, Arizona.

John Milton Hendricks was the fifth child of Wiley Winfield Hendricks and Minnie Tebeau Heidt. He was born <.hidden.> near Ella Belle, Bryan County, Georgia.

In November 1944 he was married to Jessie Pearl Bearden, who was born <.hidden.>. She was the daughter of Harvey Bearden and Florence Skipper. They were separated in 1948 and were divorced in 1950.

On 6 Jul 1951, he married Rosa Evelyn Bailey at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Wilson, North Carolina. The minister was the Rev. Fred L. Lineberger.

She was born <.hidden.>, at Saratoga, Wilson Co., N. C., the daughter of Wright E. Bailey and Ida B. Wheeler. Her paternal grandparents were William Parrot Bailey and Margaret Adline Price. Her maternal grandparents were William Henry Wheeler, Jr. and Ida Gay. William Parrot Bailey was the son of David (Dove) Bailey and Ava. Margaret was the daughter of William Wright Price and Mary Peoples. William Henry Wheeler was the son of William Henry Wheeler, Sr. and Malvina Caraway. Ida was the daughter of Bryant Gay and Matilda Webb.

I started to school in Marlow, Georgia, in Effingham County. I had very poor eyesight and was just five years old. I could not learn to read because it was too hard to see the words in the book. The depression came in 1929. My mother died and was buried in Marlow, Ga. At the time my father had six children, the oldest was thirteen and the youngest two years old. We then moved to Guyton, Ga. for about two years. He struggled to keep the family together and in 1912 moved to a farm near Statesboro, Ga. in Bulloch Co. In 1934 we moved to a farm just outside of Statesboro. I attended school at South Georgia Teachers College Laboratory School from the fourth grade on through high school.

Through the school's insistence I started wearing glasses when I was in the fifth grade and school work became easy from then on. It was a school of great opportunity and I excelled in industrial arts.

I joined the Baptist Church at age fifteen in Statesboro, Georgia.

In the spring of 1941 I enlisted in the Civilian Conservation Corps. I stayed in the CCC for nine months and was stationed in Millen, Georgia, Lookout Mountain, Ga., Waynesboro, Ga., Halo, Ga. (the Okefenokee Swamp), East Point, Ga. (six months clerk training school) and Columbus, Ga. In 1942 I went to Savannah, Georgia and worked for Western Union. That same year I went to work at the Southeastern Shipbuilding Company as a burner cutting metal for the duration of World War II. In 1944 I married a girl who worked with me at the ship yard. The marriage was not a compatible one and I was divorced in the summer of 1948.

After the war was over in 1945, I worked for a short time for Union Bag and Paper Co. in Savannah, Ga., then in Dublin, Ga. for Georgia Plywood Co. In the fall of 1945 I came to Jacksonville, N. C. to work for my brother-in-law, Clyde Robinson, who was in electrical contracting. In 1946 I did a lot of house wiring in Pamlico County, N. C. During this time I lived by myself. I did house wiring for about two years and then began to work more in the sales end of the business. Schooling was made available to me in the sales field and I excelled in sales. I continued to work with Ampere Electric Company until the end of 1954.

I joined the First Presbyterian Church of Jacksonville, N. C. in 1949. There I met Rosa Evelyn Bailey in September of 1950. We were married on 6 Jul 1951. The same year I helped to organize the Men of the Church and was its first president. The church has always been a very strong mooring for my life. I have served in many capacities in the church. Among them are Sunday School teacher, choir, Deacon and Elder.

In 1953 I purchased a washerette (laundry) which was just beginning to get established. On December 31, 1954 I left Ampere Electric Company to devote full time to my own business. It was a successful venture. In late 1956 I opened a home appliance business. In 1957 I merged with Ampere Electric Company and continued with them until I sold out in 1960. I went to work with Mullen Supply Co., a wholesale supply company for electrical, plumbing and heating equipment. The same year I dissolved the washerette business. In 1959 I built a new house for myself and four apartments for rental.

In May 1962 I left Mullen Supply Co. to go to work for Sherwin Williams Company. I opened a new store and was branch manager until November 1965. In the spring of 1966 I built eight more apartments and then went to work for the City of Jacksonville, N. C. I served as Chief Building Inspector for the city until July 1, 1978. I was fifty-five years old. I was already involved with a furniture making business, and was developing a small wood craft business designing, manufacturing, and selling. This offered a good opportunity for traveling. The woodcraft started to develop in 1970 and by 1980 I had traveled over most of the United States, promoting it. I gave the woodcraft business to my youngest son, Thomas Heidt Hendricks, on January 1, 1979.

At this writing, I manage my apartments with Tom's help. I continue to travel and sell. I am active in the work of the Church, serving as Memorial Fund Chairman. I enjoy gardening. I am semi-retired and am living a full and happy life. (End of section written by John Milton Hendricks).
